KIWANIS - Formed from an Indian expression "Nunc Keewanis" from "Bishop Baraga's Dictionary of the Otchipew language". The meaning is said to vary: " We have a good time, We make a noise, We trade, We advertise." So, at a meeting of "Benevolent Order Brothers" at the Edelweiss Cafe, Detroit, Michigan probably in mid - December 1914 the phrase "Nunc Keewanis" was shortened to "Kiwanis", presented to the 35 members present and was "unanimously adopted. This information is in "The Men Who Wear The K by L.A. "Larry" Hapgood. "A Warm Welcome to Kiwanis", the current tract for new members states: "Nun(sic) Keewanis roughly means Self Expression."
