

**\$504 !** You guys are fantastic! This was the amount you donated to our IDD Skip-a-Meal project for this year. This averages about \$5 for each attending member. You exceeded last year's total by \$31 and the 1998 project by \$158!!

This collection, plus all the other contributions puts us over \$21,000 in the 4½ years we have been involved in the World-Wide Service Project. In addition, our club has contributed \$11,000 from its treasury. There can't be many clubs that even come close to this generosity.

And the greatest realization is that with this amount we have aided over 420,000 children avoid mental retardation and severe thyroid abnormalities. Remember that it only takes a nickel to aid a child for a lifetime. So keep those nickels, dimes and dollars coming into our collection pot.
