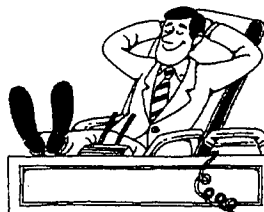

## Special Vote on Weekly Fee Regular Meeting— August 16, 2000

At today's regular meeting a discussion was held regarding the motion made at a July 19 Special Board Meeting. Secretary Jim Clark read that motion which called for raising the weekly fee to \$3.00 for each attending member.

Jim then made the following motion. "The Golden "K" Kiwanis members' weekly fee will be raised to \$3.00 for each attending member." The motion was seconded by Bob Sessler.

President McKilligin solicited first negative and then positive comments from the membership. A paper vote was then taken. The results of this vote were as follows:
