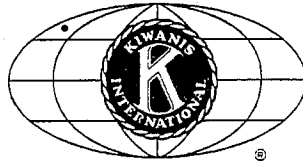

In Memoriam

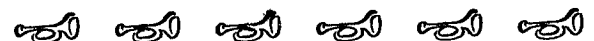

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

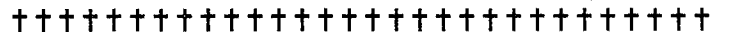

HISTORY OF KIWANIS

CONTINUED FROM VOL. 9, NO.5

1924 - A constitutional convention was held in Denver, Colorado, and a more detailed constitution for Kiwanis was adopted. It created an International Council (composed of the International Board members and District Governors) and defines the functions of major committees. The six Permanent Objects of Kiwanis are adopted. Kiwanis International becomes the official name. Victor M. Johnson, Rockford, Illinois is elected President at the convention.
