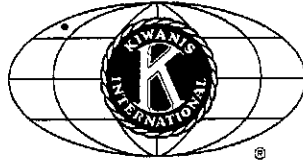

William Earl Godfrey—

Bill, an eleven-year member of Janesville Blackhawk Golden "K" Kiwanis Club died at his home, Thursday, October 11, 2001. He was born in Miller, SD, on April 24, 1917, the son of Earl

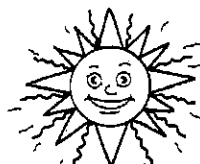

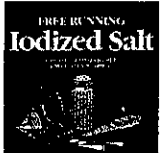

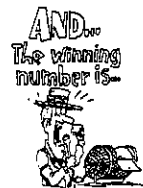


**YCPO— PARENTING**

Old Business:

01. Re: malfunctioning portable microphone. Dave Ziegler arranged for repair [under warranty].
02. Re: the formation of a committee to review Treasurer's books as required by Kiwanis International— still pending.

New Business:

01. Approved Renewal of Honorary Memberships for: Anita Fanta, Lillian Fieshko and Virginia Nitz [as per letter of request from The Rev George McKilligin].
02. Approved President Kealey's recommendation that the club present each new member with a denim shirt bearing the International Logo, the club name, and the member's name. It was agreed that this gift might well prove to be an incentive to recruit and a source of club pride. Each shirt [fully inscribed] will cost \$20.
03. Approved annual contribution to Kiwanis International Foundation— \$360 to International, \$240 to District.
