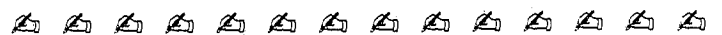
Discussion and Actions:

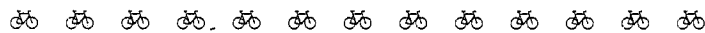

In Memoriam

Richard "Dick" C. Murphy

March 9, 1925 - March 1, 2002

Dick was born in Janesville, the son of Thomas and Nelle Margaret [Roherty] Murphy. He was a lifelong Janesville resident, graduating from Janesville High School and UW Madison. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps from 1943-1946. Dick Practiced law in Janesville, retiring in 1989.
