

### Actions:

01. Kiwanis Trail—No report. Will discuss next month.

05. Budgeting \$500 to support Lincoln K Kids Club to cover start up—Approved.
06. Discussed a proposal to proportionately decrease membership fees for new members during the first fiscal year of their membership. Reduction to be based on number of months remaining in the fiscal year when inducted—Further discussion deferred until next month.

09. Approved \$150 donation to Wilson School in recognition of our support of their reading presentation. Our club has several members who regularly assist the teachers in the reading program.
