



**YCPO PARENTING
FIRST YEAR LETTER**

On May 22nd, 8 Golden "K" and 5 Noon Club Kiwanians prepared 1,081 Parenting Letters for mailing. 2,162 individuals benefited from this project.. This makes a total of 34 man-hours for the month. The cost of printing the letters was \$231.24. The postage cost [paid by the hospital] was \$253.59. The next mailing is June 19th.



REVENUES

The Balance Sheet Dated 04-22-02 shows the club's Service Account to be in good shape.

Our concern must be over the inadequate balance in the club's Administrative Account. An area of great concern is the \$65 annual dues..

International Dues:	\$48.90 per member
District Dues:	\$24.00 per member

Blackhawk Golden "K"	\$65.00 per member
DEFICIT	\$7.90 per Member

The chart shows that dues should be a minimum of \$85, [an increase less than 50¢ per member per week]. It is the duty of our Board of Directors to raise annual dues to the fixed dues and fees set by Kiwanis International and the Wisconsin/Upper Michigan District. Likewise, it is the duty of Blackhawk Golden "K" members to amend their Bylaws by voting to accept the Board's action.

We deplete the Administrative Account [128 members X \$7.90] by \$1,011.20 with the \$65 annual dues. We increase the Administrative Account [128 X \$12.10] by 1,548.80 with an \$85 annual dues.

WE NEED TO FIX OUR ANNUAL DUES BEFORE SEPTEMBER 2002. Our 2002-2003 dues are due by September 30, 2002. Let us fix our Annual Dues problem now.
