





IDD Campaign Enters Success Phase.


The above statement was the headline of an article in the most recent edition of "Kiwanis". The article indicated that the ambitious goal of collecting \$755 million has been exceeded with \$69 million in cash and \$9 million in pledges. Upon receiving this information, our Board of Directors authorized an end to our IDD contributions to the World Wide Service Project.

Our club's initial collection was January 31, 1966 with \$27.74 of loose change thrown in our IDD "pot". From that date to the final collection May 29, 2002 Golden-K members have shown unbelievable generosity. A total of \$30,285.18 has been collected to help eradicate Iodine Deficiency Disease throughout the world. This means 605,170 children have been spared the scourge of mental retardation and other serious health defects through our members' contributions alone! Each nickel helped one child.

Some of the other money came from John Holcomb's chair caning, spaghetti dinner, restaurant collection cans, rummage sales, skip-a-meal, raffles, foreign coin collections, aluminum can collections, nickel donations, members' major contributions, pancake day ads, various guessing games, Packer pen sales, and club treasury contributions. The Loose Change Pot alone brought in \$10,996.02.

You are all to be congratulated for your generosity and should feel very proud of your continuing service to the children of the world! I, personally, thank each of you for your total cooperation in making this campaign such a success.
