

## In Memoriam

Carl E. Sandgren—July 2, 1925—May 26, 2003

Carl died at his home at 1720 E. Memorial Dr. He was born in Superior, Wisconsin and has been a Janesville resident for over 50 years. He served in the U.S. Army during the Second World War in New Guinea and the Philippines, where he received the Purple Heart and the Oakleaf Cluster. He married Dorothy Gunnerson in 1947; she preceded him in death in 1973. In 1989 Carl married Betty Worden. Carl was a member of First Lutheran Church, Saturday Morning Bible Study, Golden "K" Kiwanis, and a past member of the Sons of Norway and the Elks Club.

Carl is survived by his wife, Betty, his children, stepchildren and grandchildren.

Interment was in Oak Hill Cemetery May 29. He will be missed.

## FROM THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

The Kiwanis International Convention is being held this month, June 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 2003, in Indianapolis, Indiana. This year two delegates, Don Eckert and Ray Anderson will represent your club.

I would like to use this space today in order to eliminate confusion and misinterpretation concerning delegate expenses and expenses paid for by your club.

Each year, your Board approves an Administrative Account Budget. Disbursement amounts for International and District Conventions are included here. This year \$650 was budgeted for each delegate [\$1,300 total] for the International Convention.

The Convention Registration Fee per person is \$135. The place of lodging and mode of transportation is decided by each delegate.

Your Board of Directors has approved [02-26-03] a Policy Statement that defines the limits for reimbursement of Convention expenses. That Policy is stated as follows—

### POLICY STATEMENT:

**PURPOSE:** To define the limits for reimbursement of the expenses of club members who have been approved by the Board of Directors as club delegates to International and District Conventions.

#### A. Eligible expenses for reimbursement:

- 100% of the convention registration fee.
- 100% of the cost of one luncheon and evening banquet scheduled as a convention activity. No additional meal costs will be reimbursed.
- 80% of lodging cost at the convention site only.
- 80% of travel costs by the least expensive means to and from the convention site only....
  - Travel by auto will be computed as follows:  
[# miles x \$0.35 x 80% = reimbursement].
  - The cost of transportation by taxi, bus, etc., while attending a convention will not be reimbursed.
- The club will not reimburse expense for:
  - Delegate spouses or traveling companions.
  - Entertainment, tours or side trips of delegates.
  - The loss of personal property in relation to convention attendance will not be reimbursed by the club.


B. The above eligible delegate expenses will be reimbursed by the club when valid receipts are presented to the club treasurer and approved by the Board.

For this Convention, if a delegate's expenses exceed \$650, he will pay the excess amount. If you have any suggestions or comments, please contact me.
