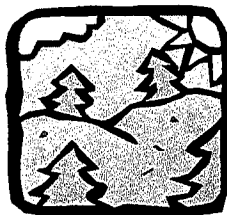


COMMUNITY SERVICES

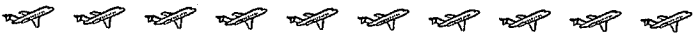

The club had its first meeting on September 21, 1983, and was later chartered by Kiwanis International on October 26, 1983. William Buckley was installed as the first president of the 30 member club, which was and remains, committed to serving the children of the community, nation and world.

The present 125 member club celebrated its 20th anniversary by showcasing the three youth Kiwanis clubs the Blackhawk Golden "K" sponsors. Student representatives from the three youth clubs spoke of how their Kiwanis Clubs have had a positive impact on their lives. Speakers included Regina Vanderlinden from Lincoln School "K" Kids, Alisha Truman and Dayna McKilligin from Edison School "Builders" Club and Bianca Petts from the Rock River Charter School "Key" Club.

Dr. Michael Kuehne, Director of Instruction for the School District of Janesville spoke of the positive impact the youth Kiwanis Clubs have on students and their schools. Distinguished Club Awards were presented to the Lincoln School "K" Kids and to the Edison Middle School Builders Club.

The Golden "K" Kiwanis Club has an annual service budget of \$25,000, devoted to serving others in the community, nation and world. Jim Clark told of the club's efforts that provided over \$30,000 for the International Kiwanis project of eliminating Iodine Deficiency Disease among children in third world countries. He recognized 29 members of the club who have received Hixon awards.

The Blackhawk Club was sponsored by the Janesville Noon Kiwanis Club. Frank Stratton and Rolland Stromen of the Noon Club, who were instrumental in forming the club, also spoke.

Other dignitaries who attended and spoke were Marsha Lee, Lt. Governor of Wisconsin / Upper Michigan Kiwanis District, Division 3, and Gail Pachucki, Governor-elect of the WI/UM District.
