

Participants were: Duane Durrant, Carroll Flannagan, John Holcomb, and Jesse Scarborough.





UPDATE, CAR ON THE ICE

Our CAR ON THE ICE fundraiser for "the Children of Rock County" has captured the attention of residents of our City. We have received media support with front-page color pictures and featured stories of the Suburban Image in the Local News section of the Gazette on two different occasions. We were pictured on the front page of the Messenger with a nice story inside. Our story has been told on Channel twelve many times on many different dates. The Suburban Image out on the ice of Traxler lagoon is an attractive subject of conversation. **Citizens are aware of our fundraiser!**

As of 1-31-04, \$6,600 has been banked. We have covered expenses and more. We have the opportunity to raise multiple thousands of dollars more "For The Children Of Rock County" in the next two weeks.

Congratulations to Dooley's, Hay's & Holcomb's ticket sales groups. These groups total less than 25% of our total membership. They have accounted for over 50% of our total sales. This means they are outselling the rest of us at a ratio of 4 to 1.
