
Dave Ziegler was the only nominee for Secretary and was elected by a unanimous vote.

Flag Day

June 14, 2004



The first flag day was celebrated in 1877. It was the centennial of the U.S. flag's existence. The concept of a public celebration honoring the flag on a certain day is thought to have originated in 1885. B.J. Cigrand a Wisconsin Public School Teacher [District 6] organized the pupils in Fredonia to observe June 14 as "Flag Birthday."

Over the next few years Cigrand continued to advocate a National Flag Day and magazines and newspapers carried articles on the subject.

On June 14, 1889, George Balch a kindergarten teacher in New York City planned ceremonies for the children of his school. Later on his idea of observing Flag Day was adopted by the State Board of Education of New York.

Many other organizations began observing June 14 as "Flag Day." In 1894, the Illinois organization known as The American Flag Day Association was formed.

On May 30th, 1916 President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14 as "Flag Day."

Finally, on August 3rd, 1949 President Harry Truman designated the 14th of June as a National Flag Day to be celebrated by all states throughout the nation.
