



W. W.II Memorial Monument

John Dooley, LaVerne Frisque, Wiley Kessinger, Fred Wiltse, and I, [Marv Hauser], visited Washington D.C. and the Dedication of the W.W.II Memorial Monument. The monument is extremely well done and is beautiful.

The Freedom Wall's 4,000 gold stars commemorate the more than 400,000 Americans who gave their lives in the war.

Each State, Territory, and D.C. has its name inscribed on a pillar with a wreath of oak and wheat symbolizing the nation's industrial and agricultural strength. Twin Atlantic and Pacific pavilions symbolize a war fought across two oceans. Key battles of the war are inscribed on the base of the pavilion fountains.

We all are honored to have seen this memorial, all the war memorials, Arlington Cemetery, etc. We hope some day you will have the same experience.




YCPO PARENTING




