

IN MEMORIAM

George H. McKilligin, age 74, died at his home in Janesville, WI, August 8, 2004, following a short illness. George was born in Janesville on June 5, 1930, the son of Henry and Gertrude [McCarthy] McKilligin. He graduated from Janesville High School in 1948. Following graduation he was employed by Merchants and Savings Bank for 3 years prior to entering the military where he served with the 25th Infantry Division in Korea in 1951 and 1952. George married Maxine Cooper of Janesville at Trinity Episcopal Church in 1959. He received a B.S. degree from UW-Whitewater in 1960 and a M.S. degree in 1965. He was employed by the School District of Janesville, where he taught at Washington Elementary School and was later Principal of Adams and Harrison Elementary Schools, prior to becoming Supervisor of Elementary Education and Administrative Services for the school district before retiring in 1993. A life-long member of Trinity Episcopal Church, George was ordained a deacon in the Episcopal Church by the Rt. Rev. Charles Gaskell, Bishop of the Diocese of Milwaukee in 1976. He served as the administrator of a scholarship fund established by Lucile Wells, [his high school geometry teacher], for students attending Trinity Episcopal Church. George was a member and past President of the Janesville Blackhawk Golden "K" Kiwanis Club and served as the club advisor to the Edison School Kiwanis Builders Club. He was a member and past president of the City Library Board of Trustees. He was an active volunteer with the Adams and Roosevelt Elementary School's church-sponsored breakfast programs. For many, many years George served as a ticket seller for the Rock County 4-H Fair, where he enjoyed meeting former students and friends.

George is survived by his wife, Maxine [Cooper] McKilligin; a son, 2 daughters, a grandson and 2 granddaughters; brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law; and many nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held Sat, Aug. 14 at TRINITY EPISCOPAL CHURCH. The Rt. Rev. Steven A. Miller, Bishop of the Diocese of Milwaukee and The Rev. Dr. Robert G. Bramlett officiated at the Resurrection Eucharist. Interment was in Oak Hill Cemetery.

ENTERTAINMENT BOOK



Jerry Kauchak worked two shifts and donated blood. We had nine members who donated blood.


The event helped 240 people and did not cost the club one cent.
