

04. We will work with Vice President Selgren to attain an average of ten members attending each Interclub. Vice President Selgren has accepted responsibility for this project.
05. We will increase Member Awards by encouraging members to become further committed to helping **THE CHILDREN OF THE WORLD**.
06. We will encourage Club members to attend International, District and Division meetings as a way


to obtain a deeper understanding of Kiwanis objectives and goals and at the same time have a good time.
