The Rev J Roy Deming

July 27, 1919— February 9, 2005

Roy and his twin brother Ray, were born in Canfield, OH. As a youth Roy earned the Eagle Scout award and worked in various Scout camps during summers. He graduated from Kent State University, preparing to teach math and science, but decided on religious ministry. He began serving many church parishes in Wisconsin while a Seminary student. He married Mirabel Hansen on Sept 17, 1945. During his ministerial career he served various parishes in WI. He was very interested in global peace and worked in various organizations bridging differences between groups and individuals. Roy was a member of Janesville Blackhawk Golden "K" Kiwanis club. He is survived by his wife, Mirabel, 5 children, 12 gr.children, several nieces and nephews. Funeral Services held Feb 14, 2005 at Cargill Church.


