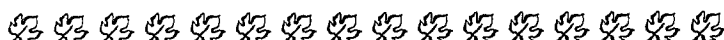

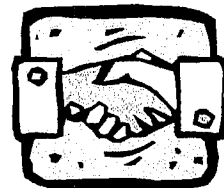

Action:

01. As per approval at special Board Meeting on Sept 7, 2005, to hold \$4,000 previously approved at August Board Meeting for support of hurricane Katrina victims, a \$500 contribution to Kiwanis International KIF Disaster Relief Fund was approved by this Board Meeting.
02. Approved Pete Kealey's re-submission of the proposed changes for the coming Truck-On-Ice fundraiser.
03. Approved proposal submitted by Maury Frey that we provide Rotary Gardens with a list of current members for a one time only mailing.
04. Approved reinstatement of last month's approved spending of \$1,000 to ECHO, \$900 to Heifer, \$500 each to Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Boys and Girls Club and 4H Club. Total \$3900.
05. Meeting adjourned at 8:38. New meeting convened at 8:40 chaired by Curt Larson our new President [to be installed this evening] to discuss pertinent new year business. A proposed budget was submitted by Treasurer Reck. A special meeting will be held next Wednesday 10-05-05 at 8:30 AM to consider the proposed budget.
06. Curt stated that our dues for new members needs to be changed because of the increase by International to \$50. It was approved to make new dues \$65 (\$50 to International, \$5 to District and \$10 to our Club).
