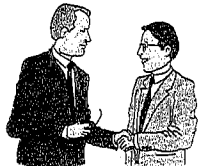

### DENTAL MOBILE THANK YOU

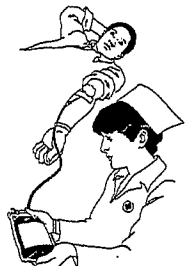
