Our Installation of New Officers will be on Sept 27th, at the Elks Club in Janesville. President-Elect Phil has a great meal and program planned for you.

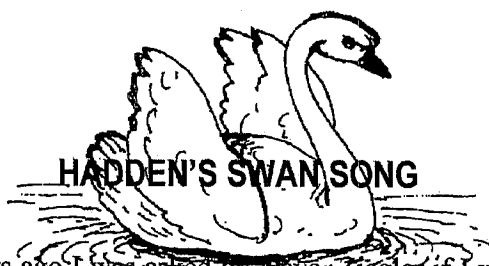
