This is an effort to make Kiwanis more visible in our community with an intensive media blitz this summer throughout the District. ### **NEW CLUB BUTTON MAKER**

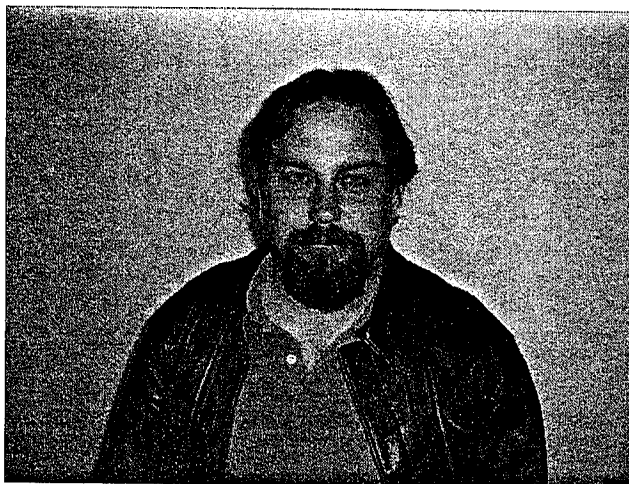
