





K-KIDS, STOP SIGNS

On December 17, the Lincoln Elementary School K-Kids presented twenty-five Tapco flashing stop signs to three police departments for their school crossing guards.

After experiencing the value of one flashing stop sign in front of their school, the kids talked about how they would like them at the other two crossings they used. Quickly, their discussion evolved that every school child in Janesville would be safer if they had those signs.

Drivers see the new signs because they have eight LED lights on each side which blink brightly when the sign is erect.

Drivers now days have more distractions than ever (*phones, lattes, some even are texting*). The most dangerous time of the day children experience is going to and coming home from school. The K-Kids knew the flashing stop sign caught the driver's eyes faster than the old stop signs.

They reached out to the Roosevelt K-Kids and the Edison Builders' Club. They then turned to the Noon and Blackhawk Golden Kiwanis Clubs for help. Wal Mart and Sam's Club gave matching grants.

Both K-Kids clubs earn their money by collecting Box Tops for Education, the Builders' club through a school store and dances, the Noon club through their pancake day and the Blackhawk Golden through the Truck-on-Ice raffle.
