

Although economic times in Janesville are hard on many people, our Truck-on-Ice fund raiser has been a great success. Through the hard effort of members, our ticket sales totaled over \$14,000! This is one of the largest amounts that we have ever sold!

We thank each and every one of you that reached out to sell tickets! Thanks to those who volunteered at the three Blackhawk Community Credit Union branches, the Janesville Athletic Club and Lions' Quick Mart. We sold about \$700 at the Athletic Club and \$680 at Lions. The Blackhawk's brought in about \$2,000. The advertisements on our tickets will bring in \$800 additional dollars. This year the printing costs were reduced by over \$650!

Thanks also to John Nevins, Ray Anderson, and Dave Peterson for their behind the scenes efforts. Special thanks go to the team captains who helped with the tickets and money. Some members chose to just make a gift toward this worthy cause.

Bottom Line After prizes and expenses, our club will have approximately \$9,500 to \$10,000. All of this money will be given out to help young children in the Janesville area. That truly is exciting!

Since the truck sunk before the sale of raffle tickets formally ended, we will be drawing for the 15 prizes at our regular meeting on March 11, 2009. The rules pertaining to the drawing are on our web site. After the tickets are in the ticket drum, we want every member to give it a turn. Our president will then draw the winners under your watchful eyes and an unbiased observer, Don Tyriver.

The biggest thing we can do to increase our sales next year is to bring in new members. They would also help with the trees, lilies, bell ringing and peanuts. They also would be nice to have around! We welcome your ideas to improve next year's sales.
