



Here are some statistics as of April 1, 2009 to help become better acquainted with our district. We are in the Wisconsin / Upper Michigan district with Patricia Brinkman as our Governor. Our district consists of:

- 6 Regions, containing 4 or 5 divisions each. We are in the Capital region and Mary Meenes is our regional director.
- 25 Divisions. We are in Division 3 and Marcia Lee is our Lt. Governor.
- 190 clubs.
- 6,185 members.
- Average 32 members per club. We had 102 members as of 4/1/2009.
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- The smallest club is North Suburban (*Milwaukee*) in Division 6 with 5 members.
- The club with the most members is in Division 22 Marquette, Michigan with 104 members.
- The smallest division is Division 16 with 3 clubs.
- The highest membership per club is Division 22 with 48 members.
- Our division averages 35 members per club.
- The lowest membership per club is Division 14 with 24 members.
- There are 14 Golden K clubs in the District.
- There is an average of 49 members per each Golden K Club.
