



DENTAL MOBILE Chairs: Curt Larson, Ray Anderson



When the Dental Care Mobile Van was here in January, 6 of our Golden "K" members worked 52 hours to help the Dental Mobile project work efficiently.

In 7 days of operation the Dental Mobile served a total of 38 young patients. The young patients received the following treatments:

38 received Examinations, 31 received X-Rays,
29 received Prophylaxis, 15 had Fluoride Treatment,
4 received Seal Treatment.

In total, 93 Fillings were provided to these patients.

Additional procedures were provide for:

11 patients who had Extractions,
2 had SSC (Stainless Steel Crown) Procedure,
and 2 had a Pulp treatment

One young man had 10 fillings and still had to be referred to a local dentist for more work.

To accomplish the work for these patients, 18 had 1 appointment, 13 had 2 appointments, 6 had 3 appointments, and 1 patient needed 4 appointments.

On an average, a patient receives between \$450 to \$500 worth of service. Therefore, the work performed on those dates valued between \$17,000 and \$19,000.

All work performed on the above children is completed at no cost to these young people thru this program. I think we should feel good that we can help make a difference!

Pete Kealey submitted a proposed recommendation pertaining to litter and trash along the state and federal highways in Rock County. Bob Johnson then explained the problem and asked the board to create a new committee to coordinate work groups and communicate with city and county officials, other service organizations, unions and companies. After discussion a motion was made by Gordon Drake, seconded by Bill Bessire to establish a committee to coordinate efforts among city and county officials, service organizations, unions and companies in Rock County to remove trash and litter from state and federal highways.
Motion approved

Pete Kealey outlined a proposed change to Policy #7 or the creation of a new policy regarding the solicitation of funds directly to the membership. Policy #7 "The Board should approve all fundraisers and other activities of Club Members so that they count as official activities of the Club". The problem

arises when money is solicited directly from the membership without Board approval or disapproval. Money is sometimes solicited by program presenters, by members, by sponsored Clubs or by extended family of a member. After a great deal of discussion it was decided to leave the policy as is. Any collections from our members will take place at the meeting following the request. It will be the decision of each member as to whether or not he wishes to contribute.

John Holcomb asked the Board for approval to pass out a form submitted on behalf of the Edison Builder's Club to raise money so that they can build a Children's Castle that will be used each year at the Janesville Renaissance Fair. Approval was granted.

Adopt a Highway Coordination Committee

The purpose of this new committee, formed at the board meeting on April 28, is to help keep Rock County's state and federal highways cleaner than what we see today. **We will not be doing the work along the roads.** Our effort to keep two Kiwanis parks and the Kiwanis trail free of trash is all we may want to do at this time.

Many Rock County highways have never been adopted, while adopted sections are seldom being cleaned. The delinquent or non-assigned highways continue to gather trash which fouls the environment and detracts from the beauty of our roadways.

There is a well established process to adopt a highway and Ben Koopman of the Rock County highway department will help train new volunteers.

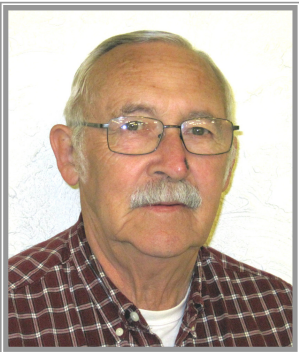
