





Walworth County. Among the featured activities are: two tractor pull contests, a demolition derby, harness racing, and the Beach Boys grandstand show on Sunday September 5.



Secretary's report of 7-28-10 was submitted at an earlier date. Motion made by Tony Guernsey, seconded by Richard Johnson to approve the minutes as submitted. *Motion approved*

Treasurer's report was submitted and discussed by Will Reck. Will Reck made a motion, seconded by Tony Guernsey to file the treasurer's report as submitted. *Motion approved*

Under old business Pete Kealey stated that our club needs to have a weekly or bi-weekly focus on the new International program, Project Eliminate. This project officially kicks off Oct. 1st and we will have a lot of information from International. We will develop some interesting contests or gimmicks along with having the IDD container changed to Project Eliminate on the donut table.

Under new business Jerry Langdok stated that one of our microphones is broken. The cost to repair will be at least \$80. We have the choice of repairing or purchasing a refurbished mike @ \$325 or a new one @ \$500. Since this expense was not in the budget we will have a weekly meeting collection.
