

Secretary's report of 10-27-10 was submitted at an earlier date. Motion made by Tony Guernsey, seconded by Will Reck to approve the minutes as submitted following corrections. *Motion approved*

Treasurer's report was submitted and discussed by Will Reck. Will Reck made a motion, seconded by Tony Guernsey to file the report as submitted. *Motion approved*

Will Reck made a motion, seconded by Tony Guernsey to approve the Final Year-End treasurer's report for the year 2009/2010, which was approved by the audit committee. *Motion approved*

Under old business Gordon Drake discussed changes to be made to our club policies. Due to changes made by International and the District for new member dues, our policy #12 required updating. Gordon Drake proposed changing ours to match these combined changes. It will be a decreasing monthly schedule starting with \$86 in Oct. to \$8 in

Sept. Motion made by Carl Cramer, seconded by Will Reck to approve this policy change of 11-24-10. *Motion approved*

Policy #19 requires clarification concerning reimbursement for the cost of breakfast for the Induction committee member and the Inductee at Orientation. Motion made by Pete Kealey, seconded by Gary Sullivan to change the policy to include paying for both the Inductee and Inductor. *Motion approved*

Pete Kealey asked about Honorary Members for the current year. A motion was made by Pete Kealey, seconded by Gary Sullivan to make Karl Petter, Bud Holliday and Lyle Platner Honorary members for 2010/2011. *Motion approved*

Under new business Gordon Drake discussed a suggestion made by John and Nancy Holcomb to change our Installation Meeting site to a local church rather than Rotary Gardens. After discussion the board made the decision to decline this suggestion, but, will consider other sites that provide easy access for all members.

Bob Johnson suggested that we create a Hugh Horswill scholarship to be presented annually at Parker High School matching the Frank Douglas scholarship at Craig High School. These scholarships will be emphasized in the Truck-On-Ice brochure. Motion made by Pete Kealey, seconded by Tony Guernsey to create a \$500 Hugh Horswill scholarship. *Motion approved*

Will Reck stated that \$2,085 has been raised for the Marvin Hauser Memorial to Camp Waubeek.
