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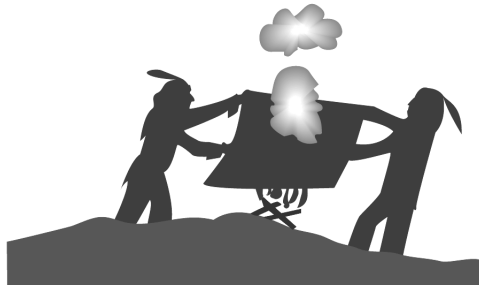

Secretary's report of 3-30-11 was submitted at an earlier date. Motion made by Tony Guernsey, seconded by Will Reck to approve the corrected minutes as submitted. *Motion approved*

Gordon Drake passed out copies of a letter from Kiwanis International concerning *Skip-A-Meal* program. After discussion the board elected not to participate in this program.

Gordon Drake passed out a copy of an E-mail from John Holcomb concerning the Edison Builders Club. There is uncertainty concerning support from the Edison School advisors in the future and finding a replacement for John Holcomb as he has announced his retirement as our club advisor. This situation will be handled at a later board meeting after more discussion with the school.

Another E-mail from John Holcomb expressed his disappointment that no parents from Janesville accepted the opportunity to hear Ken Saville explain the values of Camp Waubeek. It was decided that we will contact Ken and obtain a list of Camp Waubeek participants from the Janesville area.

Gordon Drake passed out copies of a handout from Bob Johnson concerning the flashing school crossing signs. Bob confirmed that there have been problems with about 25% of them. He is contacting the manufacturer, Tapco Signs and will advise us concerning repair costs.

Gordon Drake passed out copies of a monthly report that the secretary submits to International on a monthly basis. Our club currently does not participate in the Branded Service Programs which include Bring up Grades, Terrific Kids, Read Around the World and Key Leader. This is an area that we need to concentrate on.

Gordon Drake passed out a recommendation from the Awards Committee to nominate Will Reck for the Hilmar L. Solberg Distinguished Service Medal that is awarded annually by our district. Pete Kealey made a motion, seconded by Gary Sullivan to submit Will's name. *Motion approved*

Pete Kealey made a motion, seconded by Carl Cramer to approve the application for membership for Bob Homan. *Motion approved*

Gordon Drake made the recommendation that we consider an apron or vest with "Janesville Blackhawk Golden "K" on it to be worn during all our fund raisers, selling truck on ice tickets, blood mobile, etc. This will be discussed at a later board meeting.

TREE SALE 2011

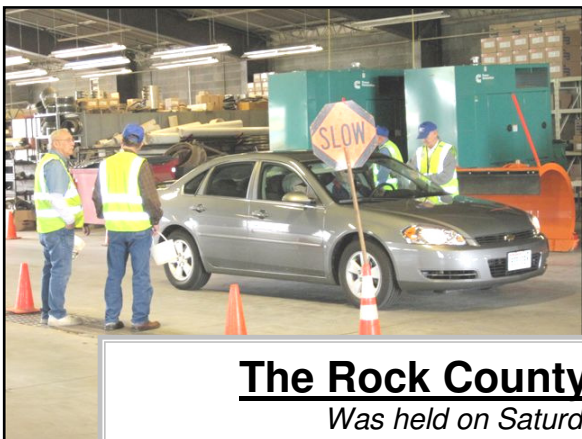
The first joint venture "Tree Sale" with Rotary Gardens is complete.
