

No Secretary's Report. Gordy requests that all board members be listed in the minutes and shown as either present/absent/excused.

Treasurer's Report, as of March 22, 2012, was distributed and discussed. Paid TOI prizes (\$5,000). Paid scholarships to BTC (\$3,000) and UW/Rock (\$3,000). - Scholarship Policies – no report.

- Lincoln K-Kids. *Glenn Disrude* will meet with new advisors during week after spring break. Milton clubs are now without a sponsor (K-Kids, Key Club).
