





Attending were: *Gordy Drake, Ron Shuler, Dan Heerey, and Carl Cramer*.


We had lunch at the Atlanta Bread restaurant and had good fellowship. The meeting was a business session for the club.



Meeting was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by President John Janes.

Secretary's Report:

We discussed the annual dues deadline and the contacting of members not already paid. Paul Neitzel stated he would look into the cost of obtaining a new plaque and engraving for deceased members of Kiwanis. No changes from last month's minutes.

Treasurer's Report:

Report dated September 24, 2012 was distributed and discussed. Will Reck updated us on the net profit from Peanut Day and the new total is \$4,652. Will also stated that the final report is due Sept. 30 and will update us next month with the final totals.

Correspondence:

Sept. 12 we agreed to let the Boys and Girls Club use the Kiwanis Logo at the end of their video. Dale Henning is the liaison between the Boys and Girls Club and Blackhawk Golden "K".

Old Business:

- Banner for Events: Rocky Schroeder gave a report on looking into the prices, sizes, shapes and materials of various banners for the club and will try to obtain a model for us to look at before deciding on what to purchase.
- Air Conditioner for Sons of Norway: John Janes reported that the new unit has been installed and the Board of Directors unanimously voted to contribute \$1,000 toward the project.
- Booth at Farmers Market: To promote the club, John Janes recommended manning a booth at the farmers market. There would be no expense involved. Volunteers would be needed.

New Business:

- Fun Day working with Boys and Girls Club: It was suggested by John Janes that instead of a fundraiser for the club, it may be more beneficial to share our time with them as was mentioned by our guest speaker and also more exposure for the club.
- Flowers for Funerals: Discussion about donating to charity/Kiwanis Foundation in lieu of flowers was thought to be more meaningful than flowers. We will look at our current Board Policy and decide if we want to put in a new policy in regards to funeral donations.
- Wishing Well: Information was provided by Bill Bessire and Lon Coppernoll on profits from the Wishing Wells. To date as of the end of Aug. we have made \$841 and since 2008 our total profit is \$3,046.93.
- Tree Sales: Glenn Disrude discussed the idea of tweaking the numbers and kind of trees ordered for the next tree sale and the advertising expenses due to the poor sales of the last project. The Board voted unanimously to continue the sale and Glenn is looking into the possibility of working with Rotary Gardens again.
- New Projector: Carl Cramer discussed the benefits of acquiring a new projector and the costs involved. Our current model is 6-8 years old and is outdated for new technology such as adapting to current computers and our current model is also expensive to maintain. More information and discussion will follow
- Milton HS Key Club: Glenn Disrude has been in contact with Milton H.S. about the possibility of helping to support a Key Club.
