

### **Secretary's Report:**

Submitted as published in the March Smoke Signal and approved.

### **Treasurer's Report:**

Will reported that when the advertising revenue comes in for Truck On Ice, our net profit will exceed what was budgeted for this year. Will moved that the report be filed as submitted and it was seconded by Glenn Disrude and approved.

### **Club Correspondence:**

Our club received a letter from the Boys and Girls Club thanking us for the \$500 donation. The club also received a letter from Blackhawk Technical College thanking us for the \$3000 in scholarship money and our long involvement with them.

### **Old Business:**

#### Umpire Funding:

Dave Peterson reported on Jerry Burhan's request to support his umpire training program held at the Boys and Girls Club. Dave is asking us to consider this request further. After discussion, Dave will contact Jerry to obtain a good description of this program, the benefits, and what support Jerry is requesting. Dave will then forward this information to board members prior to the next meeting for further consideration.

#### Dine 4 A Cause at the Lube:

The board discussed getting involved with this program and will look into how to proceed with coupling this with one of our other fundraisers by checking dates at the restaurant.

#### Nominating Committee:

Glenn Disrude gave an update on the meeting held by the nominating committee and reported on the positions that needed to be filled and the dates and timelines for nominations and elections. This information would then be presented to the membership at our regular meeting.

#### Review of By Laws:

Ron Shuler brought up for clarification the process of sending around canisters at our regular meetings to collect money for E.C.H.O. and the Salvation Army. There was some confusion about regularly scheduled dates for each organization. After reviewing the bylaws the matter was resolved.

In another matter regarding bylaws, the club received a letter stating that our bylaws and policies were not approved for the following reason: Our club has adopted a new member enrollment fee with a graduated quarterly fee of \$100 to \$25 depending on when the new member joins to be fair to the new member and not penalize them because of when they joined. Annual dues are to be paid by Oct. 1. Kiwanis International went to a \$50 new member add fee no matter what month the new member joins. KI wants to know if our club is making up the difference and absorbing the costs. Many clubs have adopted

our model of fairness to new members. We will resubmit our bylaws explaining that Blackhawk Golden K will provide funding to cover the difference between the graduated new member fees we collect and the assessed per member charge by KI and Upper Michigan District. Dave Peterson moved to amend attachment to bylaws as presented by Glenn Disrude and the motion was seconded and approved.

### **Fee Increase:**

Due to the rising costs of donuts and coffee, at some point the board may have to discuss the possibility of a weekly fee increase but due to our annual end of year appeal, we are able to cover the increased costs.
