



## **2015 - EASTER LILY PROJECT**

On April 04<sup>th</sup>, 2015 36 Kiwanians and 6 Friends of Kiwanis, participated in our Easter Lily promotion program. Funds raised provide scholarships for handicapped individuals from southern Wisconsin.

### **Secretary's Report:**

Submitted as published in the April Smoke Signal and approved.

### **Treasurer's Report:**

Will reported that the Easter Lily campaign was very successful and that the \$4,736 raised has been sent to the Easter Seals organization in Madison, WI. Will also gave an update on the status of the administrative and service accounts and said that they are in good shape. Will moved that the report be filed as submitted and it was seconded and approved.

### **Club Correspondence:**

Our club received a letter from the 4C Helping Communities Help Children Organization (a child care resource and referral agency). Their goal is to help ensure all children have access to developmentally appropriate toys, books and resources during the early learning years that are so critical to a child's development. They are seeking our consideration to support this project. The board would like more information before committing to this project.

### **Old Business:**

#### **Fee Increase:**

The Board decided to table this matter until fall.

#### **Umpire Funding:**

Dave Peterson spoke on behalf of supporting the Umpire Fund and how this fits in with our mission statement. Dave made a motion to request financial support of this program and Glenn Disrude seconded to open up for discussion. Discussion centered on not only supporting the Boys and Girls Club but a separate one time funding amount to be determined. After some discussion, it was determined to allocate \$300 for this program. The Board proposed that we talk to Jerry Burhans and ask him when he needs the money for this program. The motion was seconded and approved.

#### **Dine 4 A Cause at the Lube:**

Ron Shuler discussed the process of getting involved in this type of fundraiser and after some discussion about expenses, man-hours involved and possible net return from this endeavor, it was decided not to do it for a variety of reasons.

#### **Nominations:**

Glenn Disrude explained the nomination process for the 2015-2016 election of officers. The nominees are: President: Rocke Schroeder - President-Elect: Richard Johnson - Vice President: Carl Cramer - Treasurer: Will Reck - Directors: John Sarnow & David Thill.

#### **Membership Drive:**

Glenn Disrude expressed a concern about the decline in membership not only within our club but all service organizations. Discussion centered on ideas to generate new members.

### **New Business:**

#### **Tree Sales:**

John Janes gave an overview of our successful tree sales and proposed that we give a donation to Rotary Gardens for their help with our fundraiser. After some discussion about how much to donate, Richard Johnson made a motion to give \$500 and it was seconded by Glenn Disrude and approved. The preliminary numbers show that we raised over \$2,400.
