





Secretary's Report: The minutes were approved as published.

Treasurer's Report:

Will Reck explained the new format for the balance sheet thanks to the input by Dan Heerey to help with better transparency. He also announced that the club received a \$1,500 contribution to be used for scholarships to students going to Parker H.S. Will made a motion that the financial report be filed as submitted and was seconded by Richard Johnson and approved.

Old Business:

Appeal Letter Status:

Maury Frey gave an update on the end of year appeal to members of Blackhawk Golden K. The club received a total of \$2,733. All of the money was allocated to the administrative account and Will Reck reported that thanks to the membership, we are now financially sound and healthy.

Kiwanis Park Proposal:

There was a new contact from the Noon Kiwanis Club of Janesville. They are committed to the project for \$25,000 plus whatever the city of Janesville contributes. Our club has decided that until we know where and how the money is to be spent, we are going to hold off on this project until further details and information is made available.

New Business:

Building for Sale:

There is a new sign in the window of the Sons of Norway Building. A Century 21 Realty Listing that the building is for sale. Richard Johnson volunteered to look into the issue of relocating to a new building.

Budget Review Special Meeting:

The January Board of Directors meeting will begin at 8:00 a.m. to accommodate the Budget Review for 2015-2016.

Additional Items:

Wishing Well:

Lon Coppernoll submitted a report on the Wishing Well with total dollars received and a copy of the procedures for collecting and distributing the funds to the Hedberg Library and the boys and girls clubs. 50% of the money collected goes to our club and 50% to the library and boys and girls club. Our club received \$843.10 during the fiscal year 2014-2015 and \$5,525.46 since the inception of the Wishing Well dating back to 2008. Lon brought up the concern of getting receipts for money collected from the library and boys & girls club. He also talked about possible future new locations for the Wishing Well. Lon also presented the board with a set of procedures for the Joker Pot Raffle. Rocke Schroeder made a motion to approve the procedures concerning the Wishing Well and the Joker Pot Raffle and it was seconded by John Sarnow and approved.

Social Committee:

Ron Shuler brought to the attention of the board that a number of responsibilities are being put upon the President of the Club that he feels should be the responsibility of the social committee. Examples include the Christmas Party, Valentines Party and the Buckley Picnic. Due to the length of the meeting, the board will discuss this matter at a future meeting.

Salvation Army:

Rocke gave an update on the amount collected this year from membership involved with the Bell Ringing for the Salvation Army. There were 38 members and 8 Friends of Kiwanis that helped in raising \$5,928.74
