







Secretary's Report:

The minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer's Report:

Will reported that all accounts are liquid and in good shape and made a motion to file the report as submitted and it was seconded by Richard Johnson and approved.

Club Correspondence:

Request From Riverside, Janesville For Assistance:

Riverfront, Inc. in Janesville is a nonprofit organization that provides a continuum of support for individuals with disabilities. New Business:

Background Checks:

It will be valid for two years and the cost is \$25.00 per person. Kiwanis International or the WI-Upper Michigan District will cover this cost if the club or individual is unable or unwilling to. Increasing Membership:

Pete Kealey handed out an overview of ways to increase membership. One suggestion was to recognize people in the community who volunteer their time and talents and have a Recognition Wednesday. Ideas on how to recognize these people and get them to come to our club were generated. Also discussed were incentives and rewards for the recruiting of new members. John Sarnow moved to initiate the Recognition Wednesday idea and was seconded by Maury Frey and approved. Robert Harlow who is the Director of the R.S.V.P. Program of volunteers in Rock Co. will be contacted for guidance on who to target for the special recognition and invitation to one of our club meetings.

Financial Review 2014/2015:

Dan Heerey presented a written document of recommendations for the Board to take under consideration. Each board member received a copy and will study the proposals and the Board will discuss this matter at the next board meeting.

Peanut Day:

Rocke Schroeder as the Peanut Day Chairman has chosen August 27th as the 2016 Peanut Day. In the past, 100 cases (4 boxes/case) have been ordered. Approximately 10 cases end up having to be sold to members and/or local businesses with the remainder being donated to Echo, Salvation Army, Gifts & Trunk or Treat. Rocke Schroeder and Dave Peterson will meet and discuss the quantity to order this year. A suggestion was made to try 90 cases this year and see how it goes and possibly tweek that number for next year.

I hope you can save the date and join in the fun.


