







Meet Your Fellow Kiwanian

I joined the Blackhawk Golden K's Feb 2, 2005 sponsored by Dewey Cooper. For several years Roy Poltrack and I did the annual tree sales at the Fair Grounds.

I was born in La Farge, WI December 31, 1929 the oldest of 5 kids. My Dad was a mechanic in the Chrysler Garage there until World War 2. I attended school in La Farge through the 3rd grade and then we moved to the farm and I went to a one room school through 8th grade. I graduated from La Farge High in 1948. After High School I worked as commercial sprayer with a 1948 Jeep with a 120 gallon tank mounted in the rear and 16 foot booms on the front. We sprayed weeds in crop land, pastures and DDT in barns and out buildings. (The DDT didn't kill me but it might explain a few things)

After farming through the war years my Dad went to work in a Buick-Chevrolet Garage and I rented the farm from him. I eventually bought the farm next to him which made us 265 acres. On Feb. 26, 1951 Uncle Sam decided I should spend a couple years with him in the US army. When I returned home in 1953 I came to Janesville as GM was putting on a 2nd shift. I had planned to stay 2 or 3 months but that turned into 37 years. I started on the production line for 3 months and then got a utility job, still working on the line but replacing absentees. In 1958 I became a production supervisor. GM was starting to look better and farming not so good, so Dad and I sold the farm. I worked as a Supervisor in Production, Inspection, Reliability and retired as General Supervisor of Reliability

I married my wife Karlene in 1956. We have one daughter JoEllen. Karlene passed away May 29, 2000. I have 3 Grandchildren & 2 great grandchildren.

After my wife passed most of my time was spent with family, but the grandkids were getting older and I could see it was time to move on.

I started taking classes at Beloit College called SLU, for seniors still wanting to learn. Did a writing class at Milton. Dewey got me interested in Kiwanis, I started line dancing and square dancing. At square dancing I met Mary Ann who had also lost her spouse, we both liked to travel so the rest is history. We have been to many countries, Italy, France, Russia, China and European River Cruises and many National Parks and Civil War Battle Fields in the US.
