







Secretary's Report:

Minutes, approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer's Report:

Will reported that all accounts are liquid and that the dues have been paid. Will stated that he wrote a check for \$500 to Craig Closet as well.

Luci Cramer suggested that the dollar amounts be separated under Lincoln K-Kids to reflect that half of that amount goes for the new Van Buren K-Kids program. The money received goes into the Administrative Account or Project Eliminate if so designated.

Committees Update:

Carl gave an update on the new Grant Writing Committee made up of Luci Cramer, Jerry Burhans, Bob Douglas, Dave Soderberg and Ed Timmer. Carl stated that all committee positions are filled.

New Business:

Wishing Well Report:

Lon Coppernoll reported on the history of the Wishing Wells and the financial success of the program. Lon stated that the three Kiwanis members that were instrumental in promoting the idea of getting the Wishing Wells for the Golden K were Bob Knudson, Pete Kealey and Bill Bessire. The total amount of money collected from the Wishing Wells from 2008 to 2017 is \$14,466 and the clubs share comes to \$7,233. The money collected goes into the Service Account.

Club By-Laws:

Carl talked about the importance and necessity of updating our By-Laws to reflect the changes that have taken place since our last document was approved several years ago. This matter will be taken up at the next Board of Directors meeting.

Status of Financial Review:

The Financial Review Team is currently finishing up the 2015-2016 Kiwanis year for the Board. Financial documents pertaining to 2016-2017 are ready to go for the team to start work on.
