


Volunteering at a Blood Drive is another opportunity to show our involvement in our community. Thank you for a quick response in signing up to take a shift.

Janesville Early Literacy Program:

Will Reck proposed modifying the dollar amount for college scholarships so that we could allocate money for the Janesville Literacy Program and help many more Janesville youth than just a few students at the college level. Discussion followed on what programs should be sponsored by our club, how much to donate, when we should pay and is the money going for its intended purpose, and why are we supporting these endeavors. It was decided that a subcommittee should be formed to formulate a plan to be submitted to the Board. Will Reck volunteered to chair this committee and Carl Cramer and Tom Neumann volunteered to be on it. A motion was made by Wayne Olson to table all financial requests until the committee has time to look into the budgeted items for review. Motion was seconded by Tom Neumann and passed.

David Thill said he would talk to Richard Johnson about creating a call team to help with notifying membership of meeting cancellations, other emergencies and important announcements.

Whitewater Mid-Year Conference

One of three WI/UP Kiwanis Mid-Year Conferences was held March 23, 2019 at the UW-Whitewater, University Center. We had a record attendance of over 200 Kiwanis leaders. Janesville is part of Division 5 and will become a smaller Division 4 starting October 1, 2019.

Golden Kiwanis President David Thill and Vice-President David Kemp attended a Leadership series of meetings. They emphasized how to: run our club effectively, lead our club in projects that benefit our community, develop ways to increase club membership and develop future leaders in our club.

Other sessions were held for general Kiwanis members; attending was Linda Servais, Luci and Carl Cramer. Four sessions on Achieving Club Excellence, ACE, were attended. The sessions were: Creating a Purpose for your club, Hosting a Membership Drive, Celebrating Success, and How Can a Coach Help my Club.

Club leaders and members were participants in a number of General and Break-Out Sessions. The District Signature Project of using iPads to aid Autistic Children was presented by past Governor, Lynn Messer. Golden K is actively participating by working with the Janesville School District to obtain and distribute iPads. Special Education Therapists, kids and families are grateful.

Governor Jim Buskel and Governor-Elect, Roger Krogstad presented a session on Service Projects. By definition Service Projects are **not** associated with fund raising. Clubs have their own local projects and can participate in large area projects also. An all-women K Club, ages 85-104, are knitting caps for newborns.

A session on Fund Raising was held describing a variety of projects like raffles, refreshments at outdoor events, T.O.I., etc.

Service Leadership Programs were highlighted. K-Kids and Builders club was discussed. Kiwanis is the only service club with an Aktion Club like organization. Janesville noon club sponsors our local Aktion Club for people with a positive attitude and disabilities. There are 15 Aktion clubs in the WI/UP District, with 4 of them in the U.P.

We enjoyed a nice luncheon. A final session was a discussion led by our Lt. Governor of District 5, Jim McMullen of Janesville. This is the last year for Jim as Lt. Governor.

2019 Truck On Ice Campaign Recap

The club has completed another successful Truck on Ice Campaign.

The truck was launched onto the ice of Traxler Pond on Saturday February 9th. Ticket sales also ended on Saturday February 09, 2019. Photos and observations of the truck showed the Truck sunk overnight, between 7:00pm, the evening of Wednesday March 13th and 7:00am Thursday March 14th.

When the Truck was pulled out of Traxler Pond on Wednesday March 27, the clock, which was locked in the truck, showed a sinking time of 8:42 PM. With the daylight savings time adjustment, the official sinking time was determined to be 9:42pm, March 13, 2019. All of the guesses were immediately sorted and the prize winners announced were:
