


Rotary Gardens Holiday Light Show is outstanding and brings many visitors to Janesville.

Craig Closet:

Jerry Langdok gave an update on the Craig Closet Campaign, The club has received \$1,425 so far.

Truck on Ice:

Greg Turco informed the Board on where we are at in regards to kicking off the annual Truck on Ice Fundraiser. He had previously handed out the new revised rules for Truck on Ice and asked for approval from the Board. David Kemp made a motion to approve the rules and the motion was seconded by Tom Neumann and passed.

Christmas Party:


Tom Neumann said that the club will be about \$200 over budget for the Christmas Party because of the large number of people attending and asked for the Board's approval to cover the costs of the party. The Board approved of the expenditure.

Additional Items:

Maury Frey introduced to the Board a program called the Explorer Post Program. This program is for youths interested in Law Enforcement. This seminar is in Madison, starting Jan. 30th and involves various topics such as Shoot, Don't Shoot scenarios, Legal Exams, Processing a Crime Scene, Use of Force, Mental Health, Domestic Violence, Search Warrants and First Aid. The total cost for the Janesville Police Department to send a team of youths would be \$2,650. Any donation would help. Linda Servais made a motion to allocate \$500 for this project and it was seconded by Tom Neumann and passed.
