



Brief History of Truck on Ice



Bob Johnson, a former Guidance Counselor at Craig High school, and longtime member of Golden Kiwanis, came up with the idea of placing a truck (*empty shell on chassis*) on ice as a means of raising money for our projects. He had gotten the idea from his father, who was in Kiwanis in Menomonie. His dad had placed a car on ice as a fundraiser.

Bob started in 2002, laying the ground work for this project. He consulted with the city of Janesville, the DNR, the Kiwanis Board and went to General Motors for a Chevy body.

In 2003, General Motors supplied a damaged body plus all the pieces such as doors, bumpers, lights, door handles etc. which made a complete enclosed shell. Art Knilans had a frame with wheels to put the completed body on. Why Art Knilans? Because Art's son was a student who was assigned to Bob at Craig High School. Art, who repaired vehicle bodies and also was a welder, said he would help build this truck. Fagan Chevrolet painted this multi colored vehicle the bright red it is today.

Steve Davis from Davis Citgo has been involved since the very beginning. He stores, hauls and moves the truck from venue to venue during the ticket selling stage of the contest, and helps put the truck out on the ice and retrieve it when it falls through. He also drives the flatbed truck which displays the Truck on Ice during the Holiday Parade.

In the past 17 years we have succeeded in raising at least \$15,000. Sometimes more, and one year a little less.

The city determines if the ice is safe. There were two years when there was not enough ice on Traxler Pond to safely put the truck out. Those two years, tickets were drawn from a large tumbler to determine the winners.

In the beginning, Kiwanis men pulled the truck onto the ice by hand. Pete Kealey was the only person to ever get injured in the process when he slipped on the ice and hit his head.

A long cable is attached to the truck before it is hauled out onto the ice. The cable is attached to a post on shore so when the ice melts, we can retrieve our truck and find out when the clock stopped.

The clock was built by Pete Kealey and is rebuilt every year with a new clock and new battery.



Thanks for your support selling tickets to friends, neighbors and complete strangers during our table sales at various business. With everyone's cooperation and hard work, this fundraiser will continue to support programs for children in our area.
