







A Survivor's Triumph

Nela Kalpic, who helps survivors of domestic violence, will be our speaker on April 1st. Her presentation is important since the April 7th ballot will offer Wisconsin voters the opportunity to vote on the "Wisconsin Marsy's Law Crime Victim's Rights Amendment. Please invite family, friends and neighbors to join us and become informed voters.

"Survival is triumph enough." Nela Kalpic has every right to lay claim to that phrase, from her tough upbringing in Serbia to an early marriage to a dashing man who turned violent behind closed doors. Kalpic, 36, did survive, but since landing in Madison with her three sons in May 2015, she has done much more than that. In short order, with a winning mix of drive and charm, Kalpic has become a high-profile advocate for ending violence and aiding survivors.

Kalpic worked with Domestic Abuse Intervention Services prior to her current role with End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin.
