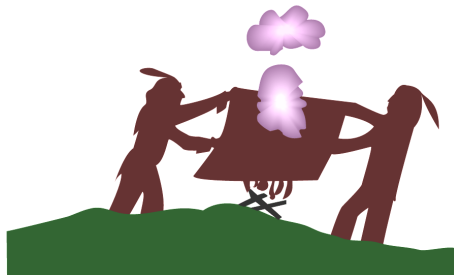

**Secretary's Report:**

Paul informed the board that the website committee has started meeting and when they come up with a model for content and cost, will present to the board at a future meeting.

**Treasurer's Report:**

Greg Turco gave an update on the Administrative Checking Account, which has a balance of \$11,728. This amount is down \$457 due to speaker gifts, orange juice and office supplies. The Service Checking Account has a balance of \$40,403. This amount is up by \$5,906 due to the tree sale. The tree sale made a profit of \$3,645 after expenses. The club now has extra revenue of \$3,850. This is 13% over budget.

Greg suggested an option to increase all general fund donations an equal percent (besides scholarships and "the closets"). John Janes suggested funding the Pregnancy Helpline of Janesville Organization, which we once funded but had to eliminate due to declining resourses. John made a motion to donate \$2,000 to this cause and was seconded by Linda Bontly and passed. The remaining extra revenue can be used to increase donations to the charitable organizations that we fund.

**Elections:**

Tom Neumann reminded the board that elections would take place on the 11<sup>th</sup> of May at the regular membership meeting and that Ron Shuler and Dave Thill would be the two candidates nominated to fill the Director positions vacated by Linda Bontly and John Janes at the end of their 3 years term. The election of officers to replace Bruce Jorenby as President Elect and Vice President Mike Wolters include the nominees of Bob Wilcox for President Elect and Roger Willeford as Vice President.

**Special Board Meeting:**

On May 18<sup>th</sup>, the board will meet at 8:00 a.m. to discuss the I-Plan. Luci Cramer will chair the meeting and this will be the only item on the agenda.

**Scholarships:**

At the regular board meeting scheduled for May 25<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 a.m. Glenn Disrude will talk to the board about the plan going forward involving the changes to scholarships such as dollar amounts and number of scholarships and schools involved.

**Flag Burning:**

We need to come up with an alternative method of disposing of the flags we have collected. Bruce Jorenby pointed out the burning operation is creating air pollution, by releasing toxic chemicals into the atmosphere, particularly the ones, which are made from synthetic materials and plastic. There is also a problem for the people who are doing the actual burning and who are inhaling these toxic fumes. (The tradi-

tion of the flag burning method was developed when air pollution was not a problem.) Since air pollution is a serious issue now, we need to use another method of disposal. We should also stop collecting flags until the issue of disposal is resolved.

**Board Schedule:**

The board decided that in the interest of consistency and less confusion, the board meetings would all be at 8:00 a.m.

**Secretary's Report:** Minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

**Treasurer's Report:**

All accounts are liquid and in good shape with the Administrative Account having a balance of \$12,147 and the Service Account having a balance of \$40,885, which is up \$402, due to the Renaissance Faire donation and miscellaneous income, and some older TOI prize money checks clearing.

**Old Business**

**Golden K I-Plan:**

Luci Cramer presented the I-Plan along with an addition of a new category entitled; Leadership and Education. She took the board through each step of the plan for discussion and revision if necessary to update what we are currently doing, no longer doing and what we would like to do in the future going forward.

Luci will write up the final document based on these discussions and present to the board, the final draft at a future board meeting for their approval.

**New Business**

**SCHOLARSHIPS:**

Glenn Disrude presented to the board his thoughts and ideas for the board to consider going forward regarding how much to give out in scholarship money and where to distribute the funds. The current scholarship plan has 3 \$500 scholarships being awarded at Craig H.S. and 3 \$500 scholarships being awarded at Parker H.S.

The board has already approved \$3,000 for the scholarship budget for the 2023 scholarship year, which will be paid out in the 2024 budget year. The change will involve giving \$1,000 scholarships to 3 students. Craig, Parker and Milton H.S. will each receive one scholarship from Blackhawk Golden K.

Glenn presented 3 options for the board to consider for the 2024 budget and beyond.



- 1.) Keep our scholarships awarded the same as this year.
- 2.) Award 2 scholarships instead of 3 at each high school and do not expand to Milton. This would increase each scholarship to \$750 each for a total of \$3,000.
- 3.) Award one scholarship at each high school for \$1,000 and include Milton for a total of \$3,000. No contact has been made with Milton H.S. regarding this option.

Glenn stated that he would be in favor of option 2 given the funding level and service area. The board will consider this proposal at a future board meeting.

**Student of the Month:**

Most service clubs in Janesville have a student of the month program. This entails having selected student(s) from Craig, Parker or Milton, attend a meeting. They provide a brief overview of themselves during the club meeting and would answer questions regarding their high school and their high school experiences. WE would invite two students from the same school to attend one meeting together. Each high school would be scheduled to do two meetings with one in the fall and one in the spring.

The board will put Glenn’s proposal on a future board meeting agenda to see if the club is interested in pursuing a student of the month activity.

**Pregnancy Helpline:**

Due to the windfall profit from the tree sale, the board voted to allocate \$2,000 for the Pregnancy Helpline during the special board meeting of May 11. After having some time to reflect and digest the wisdom of this allocation of funds, the board thought it best to have someone come in from the Pregnancy Helpline Organization and give a presentation to the club so the membership has a better understanding of what this organization is all about and be able to ask questions. With that in mind, Linda Bontly made a motion to rescind the approval of funds to this organization and it was seconded by Bruce Jorenby and passed by a vote of 7-1.
