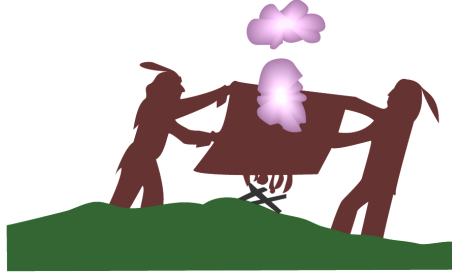

Secretary's Report:

Due to the ice storm, the minutes from the March 8th board meeting didn't get published for approval and will be up for approval at the next board meeting.

Treasurer's Report:

Both the administrative and checking accounts are liquid and in good shape. Greg Turco informed the board that the Quickbooks 2020 Desktop is being discontinued on May 31, 2023 and that the alternatives are much more expensive because they are monthly licenses. Greg recommended two options.

Option 1 is Oodo.com. which is online and professional software, that is free right now but we don't know how long that will last.

Option 2 is Software4Nonprofits, which is \$200/yr. It is custom designed for nonprofits and easier to use. It allows more than one user so we can have a back-accountant.Greg requested board approval to begin a free trial with Software4Nonprofits for one month. Tom Neumann seconded this motion to approve this trial and it was approved

Old Business

WEBSITE STATUS:

Greg Turco stated that our new website is up and running and you can go to our new site by logging in to janesvilleblackhawkgoldenk.blogspot.com. Thank you Greg for all of your time and talent in doing this for the club. Greatly appreciated.

Membership Committee:

Tom Neumann made some suggestions to the board with input from the committee on attracting new members. Some of the recommendations suggested included reduced dues, family membership discounts, free donuts and getting all the membership to invite at least one member to a club meeting. A free shirt and hat was also suggested. These are just some of the ideas to think about and more ideas from club membership is greatly encouraged.

Kiwanis Convention:

The board thought it would be a good idea for our new officers to attend the Kiwanis 2023 Convention in Minneapolis. The convention runs from June 21-24 but not all of the days need to be attended. There will be reimbursement of convention fees and expenses through our club for anyone interested in attending. Greg requested board approval to begin a free trial with Software4Nonprofits for one month. Tom Neumann seconded this motion to approve this trial and it was approved.

E.C.H.O.

Tom Neumann suggested that due to the elimination of the SNAP program or what was once known as food stamps, food distribution programs are being swamped and he proposed that our club make an additional contribution to ECHO of \$1000 to help a very worthy cause. The motion was seconded by Greg Turco and passed.

Elks Club:

A suggestion was made to provide an additional contribution to the Elks Club for providing their facility for our use as a club for occasional dinners. After some discussion, it was felt that it was unnecessary since they are already making a profit from us.

New Bylaw (International/Regional)

Bruce Jorenby brought up the request from Kiwanis International that we need to approve the new wording to the bylaws. After studying it further, we will bring it up again and vote on it at the next board meeting.
