Ray will contact potential new board members.

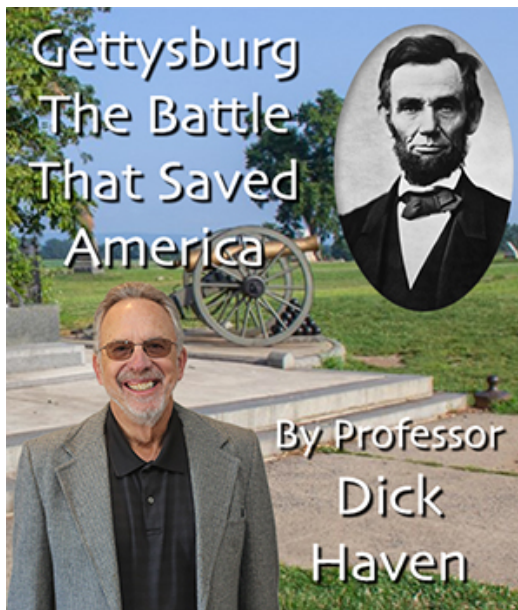

Kiwanis Lose A Valuable Member

Lon Coppernoll 1949 - 2024

Lonnie L. Coppernoll, 74, passed away at his home with his family by his side. He was born August 26, 1949, in Hazel Green Wisconsin to the late Rev. Darold B. and Nona M. (Watson) Coppernoll. He graduated from Mount Carroll high school and went to UW-Richland Center, before transferring to UW- Platteville. It was here that he would meet Patricia Briggs and they would marry on September 25, 1971 at the First Baptist Church, Waukesha.

Lon would go on to UW-Whitewater where he would receive his master's degree in mathematics education. His career spanned 37 years at Milton Middle School where he taught mathematics, algebra, computers, and reading.

In retirement, he served the community through the Janesville Blackhawk Golden K in various leadership roles, Meals on Wheels, The Red Cross bloodmobile, and Gifts Men's shelter.

Lonnie is survived by his wife Tricia Coppernoll; daughters: Jennifer (Edward) Schroeder and Melissa (Samuel) Meister.

"Meet Your Fellow Kiwanians"

My name is Wilson Claude 'Ryan' Lewis, and this is a page about my upbringing and life until now. My name came after a grandfather I never knew, and my recently deceased father. My early on family-only name has stayed with me.

The eldest of three boys, I was born in Waukegan, Illinois. I lived with my parents in a house next door to my grandmother's house and not far from my other grandparents' home for a few years. Much of my early life following kindergarten and the first grade was spent in Paddock Lake, WI, where friends and I bicycled or swam every inch of the village and a few miles surrounding in the following six years. We personally had a pool, were a block over from Paddock Lake, and a half a mile down the road, a cousin lived on Hooker Lake. My hook-setting skills and to some extent gills remain.

In grade school, I won my classroom pre-qualifier for a spelling bee after a lengthy showdown and made it to the school-wide, before falling to a word I knew due to not hearing it. I was a few years a decent saxophonist, was and am a fantastic mini-golfer, and twice won a school candy bar sales competition. In the late '80s, my grandparents purchased a computer, which fascinated me. My first-grade year was the school's first to have a computer class, where I learned touch typing (and Oregon Trail).

My grandparents, Dick and Jean Hadden, moved to Janesville during that time, where I have additional family. My grandfather and I were close. Not long after they moved, my grandparents took me along for a three-week driving tour around Europe, and again a few years later with my immediate family.

My family followed suit by moving to Janesville before I began the eighth grade. My first half year was in the old Marshall Middle School, previously Janesville High School, climbing three flights of stairs between some classes. My class was the inaugural (half) year for the brand-new facility on the East side.

My Grandpa was once a Freemason lodge master. He was active in many organizations. My early memories

of Janesville are Happy Joe's Pizza, where I later had my first job, and assisting Grandpa with making 'Truck on Ice' badges, and editing the Golden K newsletter, something for which he won a national Kiwanis award.

In high school my love of technology took its grip, and I started a business repairing computers. The governor sent a letter to congratulate me. My technology consulting company, Red Moon Computers, exists today.



After high school, the bachelor's life fit. While a few girlfriends were close, none stayed the course. Like my grandparents, I am a devoted Episcopalian. I am an active member of Trinity, and all are welcome to enjoy our internet-streamed Sunday services, which I generally operate.

My two pets, Amos and Solomon, are an 18-year-old and a 1-year-old Siamese. Amos' temperament from living with my grandmother as an only cat is generally visible dealing with the kitten. They are both talkative, shy lap cats.

In recent years, I have gone to URock shortly, and then BTC, part time. For less than a year, I was president of the student government. My passions are gardening, beekeeping (and am a board member of the Rock County Beekeepers), some mycology, fishing, and any information technology.

Kiwanis has always been a goal of mine. My family and fellow parishioners led the way. I look forward to being a productive member of our service-based organization, and doing some good.
