

Secretary's Report:

Paul will be submitting to Kiwanis International the number of members that have paid their dues by Oct 2nd and that number will determine the bill they send to our club in October.

Please pay your yearly dues of \$155 to our treasurer, Greg Turco if you haven't already done so. Make checks out to Blackhawk Golden K. The minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer's Report:

Greg reported that our administrative checking account balance was up approximately \$3,000 because of dues income. Special expenses included \$192 for the post office box and \$474 for the Buckley picnic chicken. The service checking account was up about \$1,000 due to sponsorship income for the 2025 Truck on Ice. Special expenses included \$886 for the downpayment on the tree sales sapling trees. The treasurer's report was approved as submitted.

NEW BUSINESS

2025 Budget/Charitable organizations:

The charitable organizations and their dollar amounts have been approved and will be printed in an upcoming edition of the Smoke Signal. The administrative items in the budget were discussed and no changes were made. Richard Johnson made a motion to approve the budget and was seconded by Bruce Jorenby and passed.

December Meetings:

The December 25th meeting of the general membership is cancelled and the Board of Directors will meet on the 18th of Dec. instead.

Craig/Parker Closet:

There will be three meetings in November where the can for the closets will be passed around for donations.

Insurance Costs:

Glenn Disrude discussed the high cost of insurance for our club and said he would be willing to form a committee to look at alternatives such as different insurance companies outside of Kiwanis. Since insurance is part of our yearly dues, that would also mean a reorganization of the club. We will have a year to look at the possibilities and weigh the pros and cons of remaining as we are as a Kiwanis club or rebrand ourselves.

Meeting adjourned at 9:05 a.m.







Budget Approved September 25, 2024

The board approved the charity items in August but not the fund raising expenses. The board approved the whole budget with the fund raising expenses on September 25th.
