

Called to order by President Wiilleford at 8:15 a.m.

Secretary's Report:

Paul updated the board on the status of the current membership and stated that with the two new members that have joined the club and losing two members, we have stayed the same with a membership total of 44. We are still waiting for the bill from Kiwanis International for our club dues. We should be receiving that very soon. The membership will be receiving new address and email listing handouts during the second week of November. The minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer's Report:

Greg Turco's treasurer's report stated that the administrative checking account was up about \$600 due to the collection of dues. The service checking account balance increased by about \$14,000 due to sponsorship income for the 2025 Truck on Ice.

All accounts are liquid and in good shape and Greg moved to file the report as submitted and was seconded by Richard Johnson and approved.

OLD BUSINESS

Insurance Costs:

Glenn Disrude said he would like to look into the possibility of whether we should remain a Kiwanis Club or form a new club due to the high costs of membership and insurance costs. He would like to have 7-9 members explore this possibility and take a year to study the feasibility of taking on this new role to really see if we are getting our monies worth through Kiwanis International. This committee would meet monthly and explore and determine how the club would function without Kiwanis. After the committee finishes with researching this possibility, their recommendations will be

presented to the board and then to the membership to vote on.

Hixson Award Update:

A committee will be formed of previous Hixson award recipients to determine the next Hixson award winner for 2025. They will meet in the spring at the April 30th club meeting and submit their proposal to the board.

NEW BUSINESS

Interclub Visits:

Luci Cramer has been trying to get in touch with other clubs for interclub visits. She is reaching out to clubs in Division 4 which is our district and Division 5 which includes Monroe and Stoughton. The board thought it was worthwhile to make these visits for what we learn from other clubs and would like to continue this practice.

Kiwanis International Grants:

Roger Willeford mentioned that grants are available to clubs that have projects that can cost a fair amount of money. We would have to have a project in mind and someone to write the grant proposal. Roger said he would look into this and do a little more research.

Vice President Position:

We currently have a position open for Vice President and Tom Neumann said he would take on that responsibility. The club is thankful to Tom for taking on this responsibility and the membership will vote on this matter at the Nov. 6th meeting.

Craig/Parker Closet:

The Parker/Craig closet campaign will begin Nov. 6th and we will take collections on Nov 13th and 20th as well.

Kandu Industries:

Linda Bontly presented a project for our club to get involved with involving the Aktion Club of Kandu Industries which we support. This year the Aktion Club is looking for sponsors for the first "Kandu Festive Forest Extravaganza". This involves a donation of \$250. They would furnish the tree and we would supply the decorations. These trees will be auctioned off and the proceeds will benefit the Kandu clients. These are pre-lit trees and would be decorated sometime between Nov 19th-22nd. The event takes place on Dec 7th at Kandu Industries in Milton. Our Kiwanis Club name would be associated with our tree as a sponsoring organization. Ron Shuler has graciously consented to come up with a theme for this tree and help with the decorating. This proposal was seconded by Bruce Jorenby and approved.




